




Table 6: Number of Individual Applications in which no violation was found* (Including th right to a trial within a reasonable time and Joinder of Applications)










Table 8: Number of Individual Applications in which at least one right was decided to have been violated (Excluding the right to a trial within a reasonable time, including Joinder of Application)




Table 9: Number of Individual Applications examined as to the Merits (Excluding the right to a trial within a reasonable time, including Joinder of Applications)




Table 12: Judgments finding a Violation by Rights and freedoms (Excluding the right to a trial within a reasonable time, including the Joinder of Applications)*








Table 14: Judgments finding a Violation of the Right to a Fair Trial (Including the right to a trial eithin a reasonable time and Joinder of Applications)*






